Wellbeing

We will be learning about:

- the characteristics of positive, healthy friendships.
- how we can show kindness to others.
- the difference between safe and unsafe touch and how these make people feel.
- how our bodies react to feeling unsafe
- what to do if we are worried, including the importance of talking to someone.

Art

- To select collage materials and arrange them for a purpose.
- To tear and cut different materials like paper, fabric and natural
- To explore different shapes, textures, colours and patterns to add more detail to my collages.
- To experiment with different brush marks and strokes.
- To add white to colours to make tints and black to make shades.

RE

We are learning:

- about key aspects of Jewish faith such as important symbols like the Star of David and the menorah, the significance of Shabbat and stories from the Torah.
- to re-tell stories from the bible and how this makes Christians behave towards others.
- to reflect on the Christmas story and the reasons for Jesus' birth.

Geography

To name, locate and identify the characteristics of the 4 countries and capital cities of the UK. To observe and record the weather. To identify clothing and activities worn and participated in during spring, summer, autumn and winter. To use basic geographical vocabulary. To use simple compass directions and locational and directional language. To use aerial photographs and plan perspectives to recognise landmarks, devise a simple map; and use and construct basic symbols.

History

To identify the difference between the past and present. To sort objects into groups (i.e. then and now). To role play, talk, write and draw about the past to show knowledge and understanding. To locate answers to simple questions about the past from different sources of information (e.g. pictures, stories, artefacts).

French and Spanish

Using puppets, the children will practise greetings and will invent imaginary names, ages and feelings for their puppet avatar. We will sing different action songs to ensure that key phrases are secure, and the children will play a variety of games to consolidate vocabulary including numbers 1-10, days of the week, colours, months and pets.
